GDPM OFFICER SPOTLIGHT

Officer Stephen Lloyd has been a Dayton Police Officer since April 2013 and has spent that entire time assigned to the West Patrol Operations Division as a patrol officer. He is also a police training officer for new officers who have graduated the Dayton Police Academy. He has served on the Dayton Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team since October 2015. He was appointed to the Greater Dayton Premier Management (GDPM) task force in August 2017.

Before becoming a police officer, Officer Lloyd served six years in the Army National Guard and achieved the rank of Sergeant. In 2005 he deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Officer Lloyd is originally from Cleveland and moved to Cincinnati in 2006 to attend the University of Cincinnati. He moved to Dayton in 2012 to begin the Dayton Police Academy.

In his time with GDPM he has enjoyed meeting the residents and developing a working relationship with the staff. He is committed to the goal of providing quality housing to those in need and is anxious to assist residents in any way that he can.
