New DeSoto Bass stop will be added to senior bus route

Starting on Friday, February 23, the RTA will be adding a new stop to Senior Route 64 AB, which runs on Fridays. The route has stops at Westtown Shopping Center, Walmart, Meijer, and Kroger. This route only runs on Fridays.

Riders are able to exit the route at any stop, but they get on at specific stops that serve seniors. While anyone can ride, please be respectful of seniors for whom it is intended.

The EITC is a refundable tax credit for low- to moderate-income working individuals and couples, particularly those with children. You may qualify.  <p>EITC up to \$6,318</p> <p>If you lived with three or more children in 2017 and your family earned less than \$48,340 (or less than \$53,930 for married workers), then you can get up to \$6,318.</p>	 <p>EITC up to \$5,616</p> <p>If you lived with two children in 2017 and your family earned less than \$45,007 (or less than \$50,597 for married workers), then you can get up to \$5,616.</p>
 <p>EITC up to \$3,400</p> <p>If you lived with one child in 2017 and your family earned less than \$39,617 (or less than \$45,207 for married workers), then you can get up to \$3,400.</p>	 <p>EITC up to \$510</p> <p>If you had no children living with you in 2017 and you earned less than \$15,010 (or less than \$20,600 for married workers), and you were between the ages 25 and 64, you can get up to \$510.</p>
