## CHOICE NEIGHBORHOOD DAYTON <br> VISION PARTY <br> Party: September $21^{\text {st }} 2017$ | Report: November $7^{\text {th }} 2017$



There were six activity stations asking attendants to fill out their event 'passport' and receive prizes at the end. These activity stations were an asset tree, 'I dream of a neighborhood that...", what makes a great school?, stomping grounds, art/placemaking and housing styles. Additionally on the back of their passports were recommendations for action activities that we could undertake. 3 sessions were held at different times throughout the day to allow participation from multiple different groups including children and teenagers. Below is a brief description and results for each station.

## 1. Asset Tree

People were asked at the asset tree "What makes a good community?," to which they wrote answers on paper leaves which were attached to a paper tree for everyone to see. The tree was prepopulated with leaves based on conversations previously had and survey results. There were brown leaves which represented negative aspects of the community that people would like to see go away, but these were not the focus of the exercise and thus were not plentiful.

## 3. "What Makes a Great School?"

## PART 1: WHAT IS YOUR IDEAL NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOL?

## Process

Adult participants were asked the following question: What do you think is most important to include in your ideal neighborhood school?

They were then given the option to either write their answer(s) on an apple and add them to list or to take stickers and select existing answer(s) that they agreed with. No limit was given on either responses or stickers.

Student participants were asked one of two different questions depending upon age: (1) What do you think is most important in a good school? (2) What is one thing you really like about your current school or what is one thing you would change about your current school?

## Response Summary

Participants provided 92 individual responses. There were 68 individual adult responses (some adults contributed more than one response), and 24 individual student responses. 133 stickers were added to existing responses by adults and 31 stickers were added to student responses.

Adult responses can be broken into the following 9 categories:

## Notes:

- Out of school time came in fourth in responses
- The most stickers were placed on Curriculum/classes, other supports, and parents


## Themes

Based on the most common and popular responses, the top education priorities for participants include:

1. Arts classes and programming (art, music, dance, etc.)
2. Parent involvement
3. Teacher quality
4. After school programming
5. Community involvement

## Anecdotal reasoning for not attending Choice schools.

A lot of the schools that people were going to instead of the local schools are of about equal standing in general education standards, receiving many of the same or similar grades on their state report cards. Social reasons or family reasons were some of the most often given reasons for picking schools outside the geography over those within, such as not feeling welcome within the school or not appropriately talked to by teachers or school staff.

## 4. Stomping Grounds

Highlights:
Safety and security a persistent theme throughout discussions.
Most people shop outside the community. Cleanliness and litter were among the most common complaints, especially along Lakeview \& McCall. Store improvements and enhancing the sense of being welcomed were identified as overall requests of the existing neighborhood retail. Generally, people wanted more retail along Germantown within the neighborhood.


## 5. Art \& Placemaking

The art \& placemaking wall was an attempt to receive creative feedback on placemaking opportunities throughout the neighborhood but grew to encompass similar territory to other activities. People put paper stars and flowers up on the wall with ideas for the neighborhood and then put small stickers on a map to indicate locations for placemaking and art enhancements opportunities. Below is a summary of the key findings that emerged.
